THE SIX STEPS OF WRITING PROCESS

When we write, we do more than just putting words together to make sentences.

Pre-writing STEP 1. Choose a topic **STEP 2.** Gather ideas **STEP 3.** Organize **Drafting STEP 4.** Write **Reviewing and revising STEP 5.** Review structure and content Rewriting **STEP 6**. Revise structure and content Proofread Make final corrections







PRE-WRITING



STEP 1. Choose a topic. Before you start writing, your teacher gives you a specific assignment or some ideas to write about. If it is not the case, choose the topic yourself.

STEP 2. Gather ideas. When you have a topic to write, think about what you will write about that topic.

STEP 3. Organize. Decide which of the ideas you may want to use and how to make use of them. Select the ideas you want to write about first, next, and last.

DRAFTING

STEP 4. Write. Write your paragraph or essay from start to finish. Use your notes about the ideas and their arrangement.





REVIEWING AND REVISING

STEP 5. Review structure and contact. Check what you have already written. Read your writing silently to yourself or aloud, perhaps to a friend. Look for the sentences where you can add some more information, and check to see if you have any useless information. Ask a classmate to exchange texts with you. Getting a reader's opinion is a good way to know if your writing is clear and effective.

REWRITING

STEP 6. Revise structure and content. Use your ideas from step 5 to rewrite your text and make some improvements to the structure and content. Altogether, Step 5 and 6 can be called EDITING.

Proofread. Read your text again. This time check your spelling and grammar, and the word choice.

Make final corrections. Check that you have corrected the errors you discovered in steps 5 and 6 and make any other changes you want to make.




A **paragraph** is a group of *five to ten sentences* that give information about a topic. Before you start writing, you must choose a topic for your paragraph.

- Choose a topic that <u>isn't too narrow</u>. *For example*, you won't have much to write about the topic **'The names of my groupmates**'.

- Choose a topic that <u>isn't too broad or general</u>. A broad topic will have too many ideas for just one paragraph. *For example,* the topic **'School'** is too general to write about. Instead, a student could narrow this topic by choosing one aspect of schools.
